
Additional information

Processing Notes

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Desiccant drying for 3 hours at $80 \,^{\circ}$ C ($180 \,^{\circ}$ F) is recommended. Santoprene® TPV has a wide temperature processing window from 175 to 230 $\,^{\circ}$ C (350 to 450 $\,^{\circ}$ F) and is incompatible with acetal and PVC. An SPI/SPE #3 finish is recommended (do not polish).
